SUBJECT: 52 North Stop Light Access Request

DATE: November 19, 2013

BACKGROUND

Business owners from around the north stop light will be at the meeting to request that the Council support a right-in access point remain open at that location. MNDOT will also have a representative at the meeting to address the situation.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Review the business owners request and MNDOT's response to determine if there is anything the City can do in this situation.

REQUESTED COUNCIL ACTION

I respectfully request a motion approving support of a right-in access at the site of the north lights if possible.

Please find included in the attached packet a number of letters regarding the Highway 52 and County 24 interchange that will be affected when the exit ramp south of Cannon Falls is complete.

Several businesses have written individual letters explaining the impact they feel will happen once the access from Hwy. 52 is changed. We ask that you support all of the businesses on the south end of Cannon Falls as we will be greatly affected by this lack of access.

We are asking that MNDOT leaves the exits off and entrances back onto Hwy. 52 at the County 24 location. This would require less work for the construction crew, costing less money and thus saving the businesses in this area.

The reasoning for these requests are as follows:

- There are over 20 businesses that will be affected adversely by these exit closures.
- The amount of business from highway traffic varies for each business but the majority are at 50% or more.
- Without "easy" access a number of these businesses will most likely close down within a year to two.
- Losing these businesses would impact Cannon Falls greatly
 - There are over 250 people employed by the businesses on the southern end of town, if even just the restaurants and Super America were to close this would be a serious hit for Cannon Falls.
 - Each of these businesses have assessments from the city for water and sewer should these businesses close that money will be lost to the city – if the businesses that have been active for years can't make it, they certainly won't be able to sell their businesses. This in turn would cause the south end of town into a dead zone and we don't believe that is what Cannon Falls would want.

We ask that the City of Cannon Falls support us when we bring this to MNDOT. As stated we are not asking for more money to be spent – it would be less and we feel that all of our businesses would then have a "fighting" chance.

As small business owners in the Cannon Falls Mall we are concerned by the decision to close the County Rd 24/Hwy 52 intersection. Currently 28,000 cars drive by a day on average many stopping at one of the two lights giving them a reason to stop. This gives motorists an opportunity to pull off for gas, food, drinks and allows them to see other nearby business. We have seen what has happened to Hampton and are worried what the loss of this access means to our businesses. With Cannon Falls population around 4800, we rely on freeway traffic for a large part of our business. We are the first stop for many motorists and they ask for other attractions and business's downtown. Without that contact, our community will suffer.

Removing the lights, moving access further south and closing County 24 intersection and ramps will have a big impact on all of our business. We all agree it is great for safety of motorists but not for business. The overpass at 24 is not scheduled for quite some time and still may not happen at a later date. We would like to see the turning lanes on County 24 left open and add multiple signs promoting local business. We need and rely on Hwy 52 traffic. What is the plan of the City/ County/State to give people a reason to stop and not bypass Cannon Falls? From our research motorists are more likely to continue on to their destination than to exit on a ramp.

I'm writing to express support for common sense accommodations to minimize the detumental impact to local businesses at the completion of the US 52 interchange project in Cannon Falls.

As a retail business heavily dependent on access to US 52, we are frustrated by the rigid MnDOT policies and decision making structure that have driven this process. These policies and their disregard for basic concessions to local businesses will limit our growth, and the economic potential of many other businesses like ours. We ask MnDOT, in cooperation with businesses and local government, to reconsider right-turn-only access at the current County 24 intersection and to amend signage policies at the new interchange.

Although we understand the safety impetus behind the interchange project, a right-turn-only access point from both the northbound and southbound lanes would resolve the safety issues by chiminating cross-traffic, while providing continued convenient access to over a dozen existing businesses. In fact, MnDOT has implemented this exact method 10 miles north on US 52 in Hampton, to support access and preservation of local businesses.

Regarding signage, we were notified by MnDOT on August 15°, 2013 that our Specific Service Sign will be permanently removed at the completion of the interchange construction project. We applied for, paid for, and received our Specific Service Sign in 2008, with the contractual understanding that our sign would remain for a minimum period of 12 years. Now, when we will already be suffering from loss of convenient access to US 52, MnDOT is placing additional and undue-burden by concurrently removing business directional signage. We have made requests for accommodation with placement at the new interchange, but MnDOT policy dictates that there shall be no Specific Service Signage at the new location.

As a business owner and tax paver, it's frustrating to see a process being driven without imput from those that will be most heavily impacted: local businesses. We simply ask MnDOT to reconsider their position on right-turn-only access and Specific Service Signage. We feel our requests are reasonable and equitable, given the obvious impact that full closure of the current County 24 intersection will have on our business.

May common sense and collaboration prevail.

Dear Naji Aljabry,

We also are concerned about the closing of our access on Highway 52.

Our business is heavily dependent on commuters on the highway and the ease of which they can access our location. We are extremely concerned that any closure of access will negatively impact our business. Customers make the decision to stop based on accessibility and visibility and they will not see us traveling north until they have passed the exit. It is also unlikely that they will double –back travelling south once they have passed by. We estimate that over 65% of our business comes from travelers and visitors to the city.

This closure will impact not only our ability to remain in business but will have a great economic impact on the area.

We employ over 70 people in our peak season with an estimated annual payroll of \$720,000.00. If we cannot maintain a certain level of transactions, we would be forced to lay off employees or potentially close the location. That would result in lost tax revenue, jobs, and local business and school support. We appreciate your reaching out to us regarding this issue.

My name is Jeremy Lohrke, I own the Dairy Queen located at 31943 64th avenue in Cannon Falls. I've worked at Dairy Queen for 17 years. I started out as the Dilly Bar dipper at age 15. At age 21 I was managing the store in Mahtomedi Minnesota. I purchased the Cannon Falls store on a contract for deed in 2007. I have invested a lot of blood, sweat, tears and money to improve the appearance and customer experience at my DQ. I have encountered many challenges owning and operating a middle volume store over the last 6 years, but I'm afraid those will pale in comparison to those ahead.

The new interchange is coming. I have been driving on the new road and it is going to make it much more difficult for my customers to frequent the store. Right now cars only have to drive 150 feet to visit my store. After the project is complete, they will have to drive over 4/10ths of a mile. I proactively reached out to MNDOT to get the store on the road signs with arrows where to turn off the exit. Unfortunately they will only be putting up a generic sign that says "food" with no direction.

I'm in the business of serving delicious food & top shelf deserts in a quick service restaurant. I have some of the most loyal customers that would drive 5 miles to patronize my store. The majority of my customer base comes right off the highway, and those customers are very fickle & impulsive. With actual highway signs that give advance notice of the exit and what is available at the exit, & leaving the right turns at both intersections like the right turn only at Oscars in Hampton it will deaden the blow & make it easier to get through the first couple years. With a massive road project adding some road signs & right turns wouldn't cost anything. If you are able to do these 2 simple things you will give us a fighting chance.

Recently, we received a letter, from Country Kitchen in Cannon Falls stating their concerns regarding the removal of the stop light intersection at Hwy 52 and Hwy 24. As you recall, we emailed you in January, 2011 with the same concerns. We met with Craig Lenz finally in March, 2011. And, put our concerns on record at the Cannon Falls City Council Meeting in March, 2011. Now, we understand that approximately 16 of the businesses in Cannon Falls have finally understood that the on/off ramp at Hwy 52 & Hwy 24 is scheduled to be removed and also believe this will be a detrimental to their businesses.

We concur with Dennis and Karol Dahl, owners of the Country Kitchen. We are very concerned about our business and believe that the access to the Super America from the on/off ramp currently planned ¼ of a mile south, will be devastating to our business. We get approximately 70% of our business from Hwy 52 traffic. Gas station business is an 'ease of use' business. Without easy access, the business will fail. We have been in this business for 15 years and would never buy a gas station without visibility and easy access (in & out). They just are not successful and eventually close.

We intend to get together as a group of local businesses and would like the proper attention to this matter and the plans adjusted. Although after meeting with Craig Lenz in March 2011, we understand the safety concerns, we are not understating the concerns of loosing local business and economy. This needs to be readdressed. There must be a compromise between loss of business/jobs and road safety.

If these businesses fail, hundreds of local people, families, will lose their jobs.

All we are asking is that you leave the existing exit lanes at Hwy 52 and Hwy 24 open. This is already done by Little Oscar so it seems that it should be able to be done in Cannon Falls, too.

I am CC'ing all of the local businesses and our State Representatives and asking for their help.
