SUBJECT: SETTING FEES FOR CHICKEN PERMIT

BACKGROUND

The City Council recently adopted an ordinance allowing urban chickens in the City limits. One of the requirements of the ordinance states that the chickens must be permitted. Therefore the fees for the permit need to be established.

STAFF RECOMMENDATIONS

Staff recommends that the initial application fee be set at \$20. This fee would only be charged the first year unless the permit was revoked and another application submitted. Also, if there is an amendment to an existing permit, it would be considered a new application with the initial fee due.

Staff is also recommending the fee of \$5 per chicken per year. As per the ordinance, each permit will expire on December 31 and must be renewed annually to continue the keeping of the chickens.

As per the ordinance, if a permit is not approved the permit fees will not be refunded. Also, permit fees will not be pro-rated.

An example of the fee calculation for someone with six chickens would be the initial fee of \$20 and \$30 for the six chickens for a total of \$50. The following year would be \$30 as long as the initial application was still in force (no amendments or revocations).

REQUESTED COUNCIL ACTION

Staff respectfully requests a motion to adopt Resolution 2272, setting the fees for chicken permits.
