## RESOLUTION VACATING A PART OF COLVILLE STREET IN THE CITY OF CANNON FALLS

WHEREAS, it has been proposed to vacate part of an existing platted street and alleyway; and

WHEREAS, following duly given notice, the City Council of Cannon Falls has held a public hearing on May 7, 2019 and considered comments and objections thereto and found that the vacation of said platted street and alleyway is in the public interest; and

WHEREAS, by Resolution No. 2422 the City Council vacated the alleyway but not part of Colville Street pending further review of the legal description.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF CANNON FALLS, GOODHUE COUNTY, MINNESOTA, that the following part of Colville Street is hereby vacated:

The platted eighty (80) foot wide Colville Street right-of-way lying between Block 55 and Block 56 and Eighth and Ninth Streets South, Original Plat of the City of Cannon Falls reserving a permanent thirty (30) foot wide utility, drainage and walkway easement between and connecting Eighth and Ninth Streets South.
